

SUPERINTENDENT'S MESSAGE



In March of 2020 education in Ohio grounded to a halt. The COVID-19 crisis started as "an extended Spring Break" for students and staff, but continued to expand until schools were shuttered until the end of the 2019-2020 school year. Avon Lake City School District, like many school systems, was able to shift quickly to remote learning and save some academic integrity.

Many student activities were also modified. Drive-by student recognitions, Prom "on the doorstep" picture contests, and individual student/family commencements that took three days to complete were just a few of the innovations staff, schools, and school districts implemented in order to make up for the loss of traditional activities at the end of a school year.

I am so proud of our staff, students, and families as they worked together to overcome the obstacles created by the guidelines established for in-person education and the newness of 100% remote learning. Add in the constant changes experienced throughout the year as the crisis progressed and we can only be amazed by the positive experience that has been created for our students.

Core academics and the social/emotional health of our students has been the focus of our teaching and support staff throughout the year. Emotional support of our teaching and non-teaching staff, along with providing enhanced academic resources, has been a priority by the administration and School Board. A "big picture" view has allowed us to move forward taking care of "today" while preparing for next year and the future. There will be gaps, but we are being very purposeful in our approach to support any student who needs to "catch up."

A key to our success in all areas is the effort that has been made to keep "normal" activities available for students beyond core academics. Avon Lake City School District has always focused on educating "the whole child," and the pandemic has not changed that goal in theory or practice.

When I was in school I learned that the definition of a line was a series of points. I see learning much in the same way. We start learning when we are born and continue until we die. Our learning lines need to be uninterrupted and each point along that line needs to count as much as possible. In the 2020-2021 school year Avon Lake Schools didn't pause and wait for the COVID crisis to end. We persevered together and added another point to everyone's learning line. It has been hard, but we are better for this experience, and we cannot wait until we add another point along our learning line in the 2021-2022 school year.

Thank you to the continued support from our staff, students, families and the Avon Lake community. We strive for EXCELLENCE in the Avon Lake City Schools and together we can achieve great things.

Avon Lake students combined to earn 12 Gold Keys, and 21 Silver Keys. Gold Key winners advanced to to national jurying in New York City.

- The Avon Lake High School Choral program proudly sent 2 singers to OMEA All-State Chorus.
- The Avon Lake High School Choral Program launched a new course called musical connections, where students of music learn the art of recording and mastering audio in a collaborative environment.
- The Marching Shoremen made their 10th trip to OMEA State Marching Band Finals.


