
Dear Avon Lake Community,

On August 27, 2021, the district adopted a mask requirement for students in grades K-6 due to COVID-19 issues. As part of that adoption, we indicated that the decision would be reviewed by the end of this week. This communication is to inform you that the K-6 mask requirement will remain in effect during the hours of school operation, and that it will be re-evaluated again on or before Friday, October 22, 2021 to determine what our course of action will be for the school week that begins on Monday, October 25, 2021.

Throughout the pandemic, we have collaborated with numerous organizations including the Ohio Department of Health, Lorain County Health Department, Cleveland Clinic, University Hospitals and local governmental agencies. Based on current data from the LCPH and ODH websites, COVID-19 has surged in Lorain County in the last several weeks. Specific Avon Lake City Schools data can be found on our website which is updated daily.
