COMMUNITY

Avon Lake City School District is a Suburban Residential city with a population of 24,786 located 18 miles west of Cleveland on the shores of Lake Erie.

HIGH SCHOOL

Avon Lake High School has approximately 1,300 students in grades 9-12 and has been a U.S. News and World Report Nationally Ranked High School annually since 2007. ALHS is currently ranked #2 in Lorain County and #11 in the Cleveland Region.

A total of 21 credits is required for graduation including 4 English, 4 Math, 3 Science, 3 Social Studies, .5 Health, .5 Physical Education, and 1 Fine Art or Business or Technology or World Language. Lorain County JVS graduates must have 4 English, 4 Math, 3 Social Studies, 3 Science and .5 Health, and .5 Physical Education. All 9th and 10th grade students must be enrolled in six classes minimum each semester, while all 11th and 12th grade students must be enrolled in a minimum of five.

GRADING SCALE

Grade point average is based on semester averages, with a four point A scale for College Prep Courses and a five point A scale for Honors, CCP, and AP courses. Pursuant to Ohio law, effective 2015-16, all CCP courses reflected on the high school transcript should be considered on the conversion of 3 or more hours of college coursework = 1 high school credit. ALHS includes weighted CCP course credit in calculating high school GPA.
