- Attend a CC+ information session.
- Complete the Google **Intent to Participate Form** with your parents and turn in before **April 1, 2026**.

- Make an appointment to see your Guidance Counselor **as soon as you've decided to participate**.

- Meet with your guidance counselor to select college courses and finish completion of the CC+ application. School counselors will upload transcripts to the LCCC application portal, you will then receive an acceptance or denial letter from LCCC along with further instructions.
- If your unweighted GPA is below a 3.0, you will need to take your Accuplacer Assessment at LCCC in College Center before school lets out (**However, your target testing date is prior to May 16, 2026**). Visit www.lorainccc.edu/testingcenter for lab hours, lab location and sample test questions and topics.
- OR...** collect your ACT or SAT test results to bring with you to your advising session.
- Attend an advising session at LCCC by appointment to learn if you qualify for all you want to take.
- Schedule any LCCC site courses with your academic advisor (early registration helps with course and section selection). You will need to meet with your HS counselor prior to setting up an appointment with LCCC advisor.
- The Marketing Office will register you for any LCCC high school site classes sometime over the summer.

Note: ALCS will seek reimbursement 1) if your student receives a failing grade at the end of the college course, or 2) If the student withdraws from or drops the college course subsequent to the 14th calendar day after the particular course began.
